When you have Roman numerals, and you see them next to each other, you simply add them together. For instance, take VI. Here, you have V and I. Since they are beside each other, you add V and I together. SO VI menas 5+1, which equals 6.

When you see a smaller letter in front of a bigger letter in Roman numerals, it's like taking away the smaller one from the bigger one. For instance, in CD, you have C and D. Since C is smaller than D, you subtract C from D, like this: D - C. So, CD means 500 - 100, which equals 400.
