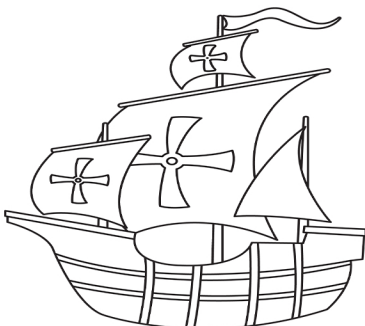


In August 1492, Columbus and his crew set sail from Spain. They sailed for many weeks without seeing any land. The sailors were scared and wanted to turn back. Columbus encouraged them to keep going. He believed they would find land soon.

On October 12, 1492, they finally saw land. Columbus thought he had reached Asia, but he was actually on an island in the Bahamas. He called the people he met there "Indians" because he thought he was in the Indies, a part of Asia.

Columbus made four trips to the New World, but he never realized he had discovered a new continent. He explored parts of the Caribbean, Central America, and South America. Columbus's voyages changed the world forever. They led to more exploration and the eventual settlement of the Americas by Europeans.

Although Columbus is celebrated for his discoveries, his voyages also had negative effects. The arrival of Europeans brought diseases that the native people had never encountered, and many died. The Europeans also took over the land and resources, often treating the native people harshly.



Today, we remember Columbus for his courage and determination. His voyages marked the beginning of a new era of exploration and contact between different parts of the world. However, it's also important to understand the impact his journeys had on the native populations.
