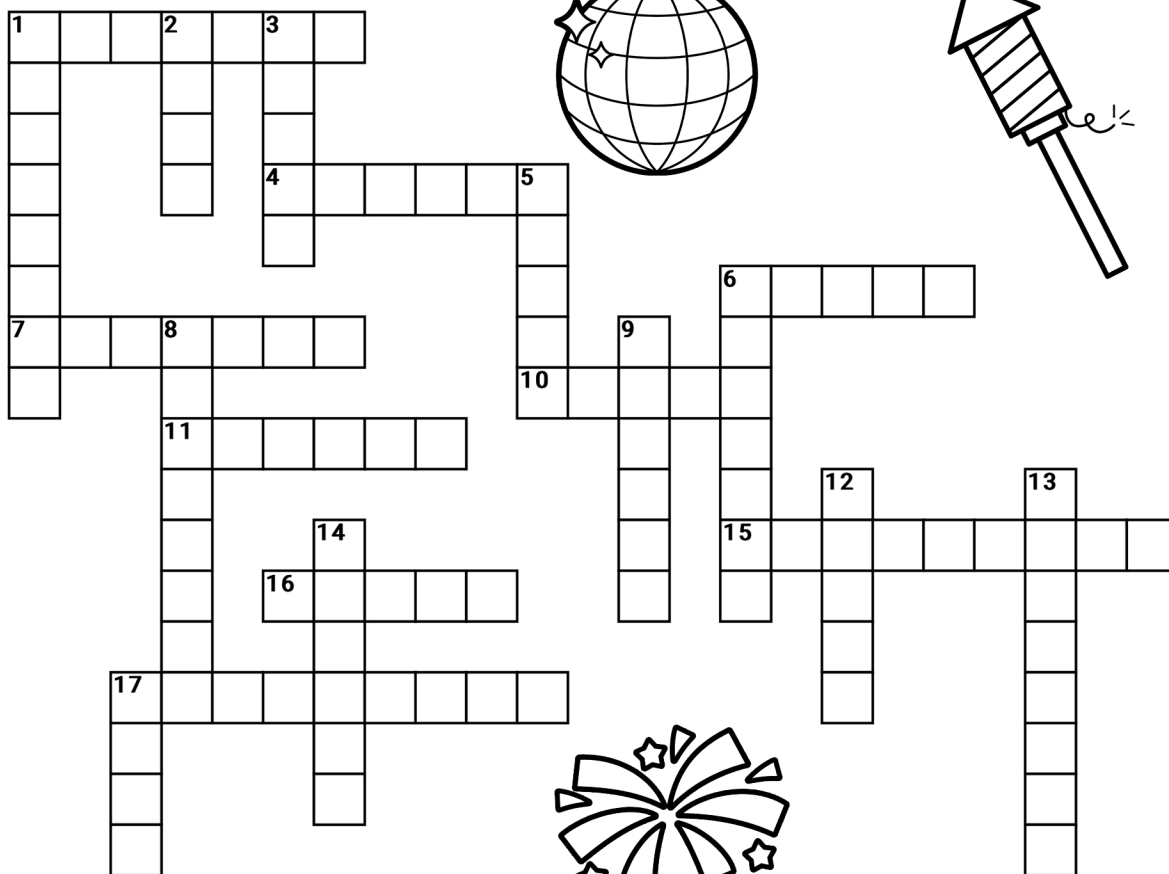

CROSSWORD PUZZLE

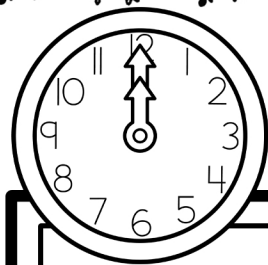

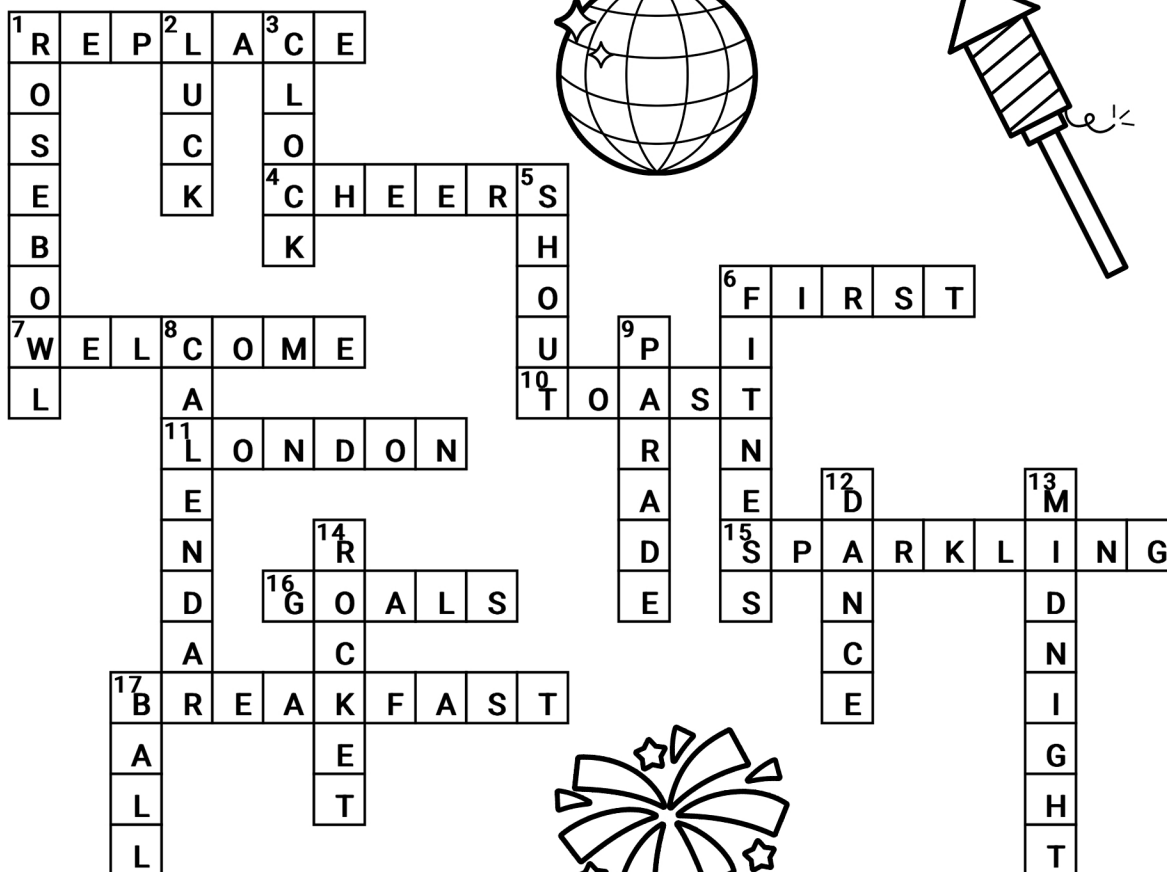
