Basic Coordinating Conjunctions

and- I like apples and oranges.

but- I ran fast, but I was late.

Do you want juice or water?

so- It was cold, so I wore a coat.

for- He is happy, for he won a prize.

yet - I was tired, yet I finished.

because - I stayed in because it rained.

if - I'll help you if I have time.

when- when - I smile when I see my dog.

while - She sang while I danced.

nor- I don't like peas, nor does she. although - Although it's late, I'm awake.

Subordinating Conjunctions

after- We ate lunch after recess.

before- Wash your hands before dinner.

since- I haven't played since Monday.

unless- You can't play unless you clean up.

until- Wait until I'm ready.

even though- Even though it's hard, I try.

whenever-I laugh whenever he jokes.

> once-We'll leave once you're ready.

She smiled as she walked in.

though-I went out, though it was cold.

as long as-You may go as long as you ask.

wherever-I go wherever she goes.

Subordinating Conjunctions

either- You can either stay or go.

neither- Neither Ben nor Mia came.

not only- She's not only smart but also kind.

both/and- He has both a dog and a cat.

whether/or- I'm not sure whether it's real or not.

as/as- He is as tall as his dad.

no sooner/than- No sooner did I sit than the bell rang.

rather/ than- I'd rather read than watch TV.

such/that- It was such a loud noise that I jumped.

if/then- If it rains, then we'll stay in.

just as/so- Just as the sun sets, so does the moon rise. hardly/when- I had hardly eaten when the phone rang.
