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COMMUNICATE RESULTS

Scientists share their discoveries through posters, videos, reports, or presentations so others can learn from them. Include your question, hypothesis, procedure, data, and conclusion, plus any problems you had or things you might do differently next time.

EXAMPLE QUESTIONS

1. "My results show that salt water freezes more slowly than fresh water, which supports my hypothesis."
2. "Bouncy balls dropped from higher heights did bounce higher, proving my hypothesis correct."
3. "The mint toothpaste did not keep breath fresh longer than other types, so my hypothesis was incorrect."
4. "Adding music to plants' environment did not affect their growth rate, disproving my hypothesis."
5. "The paper airplanes with wider wings flew farther than those with narrow wings, supporting my hypothesis."
