REFERENCE GUIDE

BOOK:

FORMAT: Author Last Name, Author First Name.

Title of Book. City of Publication: Publisher, Date of Publication.

EXAMPLE: Rowling, J.K. Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone. New York: Scholastic, 1998.

BOOK WITH TWO AUTHORS:

FORMAT: Author Last Name, Author First Name and Author Last Name, Author First Name.

Title of Book. City of Publication: Publisher, Date of Publication.

EXAMPLE: Smith, John and Williams, Sarah. Amazing Science Facts. Boston: Education Press, 2023.

MAGAZINES:

FORMAT: Author. "Title of article."

Title of Magazine Date: Page numbers.

EXAMPLE: Johnson, Maria. "Ocean Explorers." National Geographic Kids March 2024: 14-19.

NEWSPAPERS:

FORMAT: Author. "Title of article." Name of Newspaper

Day/Date: section.page number.

EXAMPLE: Chen, David. "School Science Fair Winners." Bismarck Tribune 15 Jan. 2024: B3.

WEBSITES:

FORMAT: Author (if available). "Title of Webpage." Name of Website. Publisher/Sponsor,

Date published or accessed. <URL>.

EXAMPLE: National Geographic. "Amazing Animal Facts." National Geographic Kids. National Geographic Society, 15 March 2024. <www.natgeokids.com/animals>.

VIDEOS/YOUTUBE:

FORMAT: Creator/Channel Name. "Title of Video." Platform. Date uploaded. <URL>.

EXAMPLE: Crash Course Kids. "What is Photosynthesis?" YouTube.
