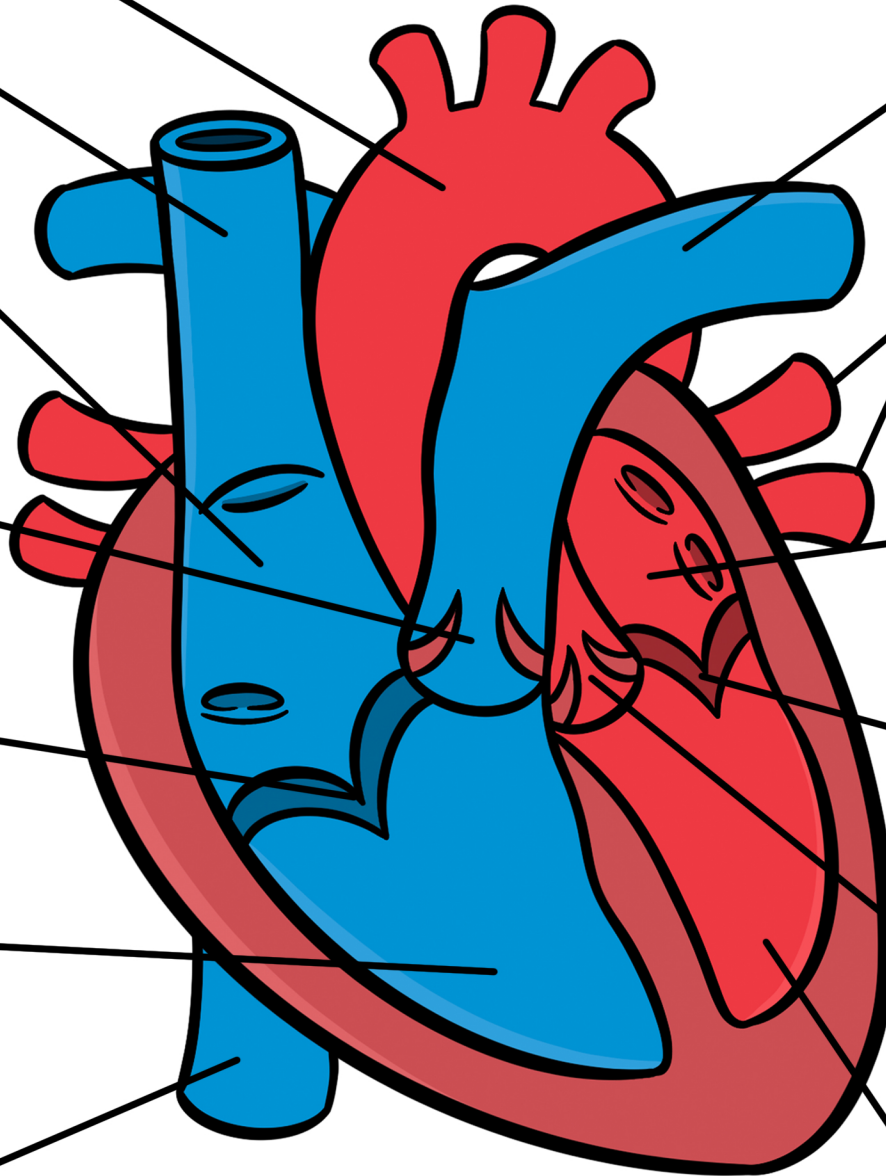

Parts of a Human Heart Definition Labels

Aorta

The large artery that carries oxygen-rich blood from the heart out to the body.

Aortic Valve

Opens to let blood leave the left ventricle into the aorta, then closes to stop it from flowing backward.

Inferior Vena Cava

The large vein that returns oxygen-poor blood from the lower body to the heart.

Left Atrium

Receives oxygen-rich blood coming from the lungs and pumps it into the left ventricle.

Left Ventricle

Pumps oxygen-rich blood out to the entire body through the aorta.

Mitral Valve

Opens to let blood flow from the left atrium into the left ventricle, then closes to stop backflow.

Pulmonary Artery

Carries oxygen-poor blood from the heart to the lungs to pick up oxygen.

Pulmonary Valve

Opens to let blood flow from the right ventricle into the pulmonary artery, then closes to stop backflow.

Pulmonary Veins

Carry oxygen-rich blood from the lungs back to the heart.

Right Atrium

Receives oxygen-poor blood returning from the body and pumps it into the right ventricle.

Right Ventricle

Pumps oxygen-poor blood to the lungs through the pulmonary artery.

Superior Vena Cava

The large vein that returns oxygen-poor blood from the upper body to the heart.

Tricuspid Valve

Opens to let blood flow from the right atrium into the right ventricle, then closes to stop backflow.
