

LIFE CYCLE OF AN OAK TREE VOCABULARY CARDS



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young
oak

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An oak tree that is still growing and getting stronger. Its trunk is getting thicker and its branches are spreading out wider.

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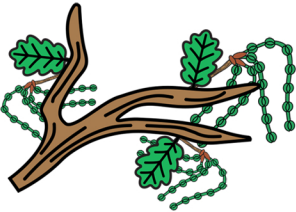
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mature
oak

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A full-grown oak tree with a wide, thick trunk and many large branches. It is strong enough to start producing flowers and acorns.

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flowering
oak

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A mature oak tree that has grown small flowers called catkins. The flowers are pollinated so the tree can make acorns.

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oak with
acorns

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An oak tree that has been pollinated and is now growing acorns. Each acorn holds a seed that can fall and grow into a new oak tree!

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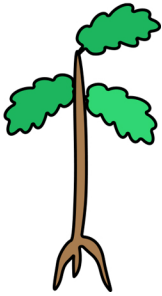
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acorn

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A small, round nut with a cap on top. It holds a tiny seed inside that can grow into a mighty oak tree!

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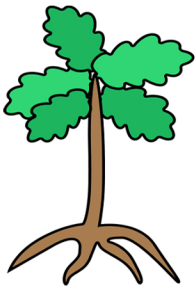
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seedling

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A tiny young oak tree that has just sprouted from the acorn. It has a small stem and the first few leaves reaching toward the sun.

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sapling

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A young oak tree that is growing taller but is still thin and flexible. It has more leaves and branches than a seedling.

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
