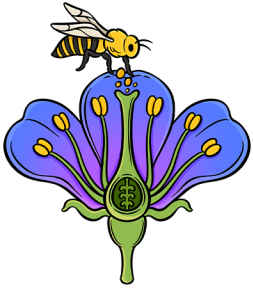


BEEHIVE VOCABULARY CARDS



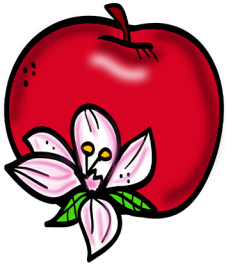
nectar

A sweet liquid made by flowers that is collected and carried back to the nest.



pollen

A fine, powdery substance made by flowers that sticks to legs and hair while gathering food.



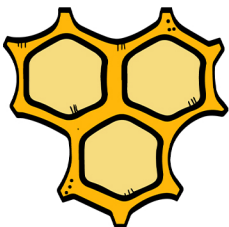
flower

The part of a plant that produces nectar and pollen and attracts visiting insects.



pollinator

An animal that carries pollen from one bloom to another, helping plants make seeds and fruit.



honeycomb

A structure made of six-sided wax cells used to store food and raise young.

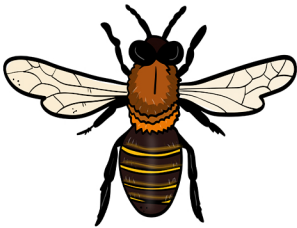
queen bee

The single largest member of the colony whose main job is laying eggs.



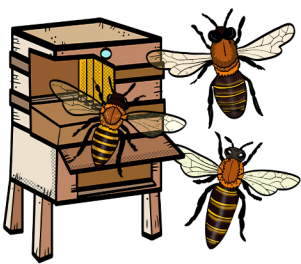
worker bee

A female member of the colony that gathers food, builds the nest, and cares for young.



drone

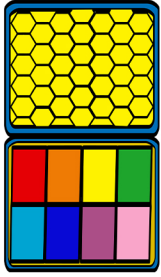
A male member of the colony whose only job is to mate with a new queen.



colony

A large group of these insects living and working together as one community.

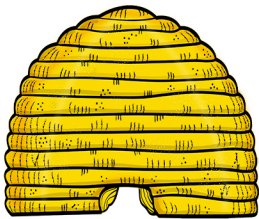
beeswax

A soft, natural material made by workers and shaped into the six-sided cells of the nest.



honey

A thick, sweet food made by mixing nectar with enzymes and storing it in wax cells.



hive

The structure, natural or built by people, where a colony lives and stores its food.
