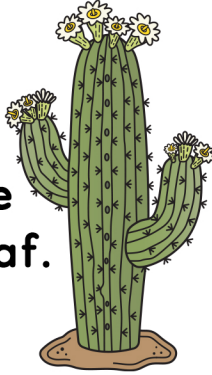


TWO TRUTHS & A LIE: CACTUS

Saguaro cacti can live over 150 years.

A cactus's spines are actually a type of modified leaf.



Cacti only grow in the United States.

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TWO TRUTHS & A LIE: CACTUS

A large saguaro can store up to 200 gallons of water.

Bats help pollinate saguaro flowers at night.



Cactus flowers always bloom during the daytime.

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TWO TRUTHS & A LIE: CACTUS

The prickly pear cactus has flat, paddle-shaped stems called pads.



All cacti have the exact same shape.

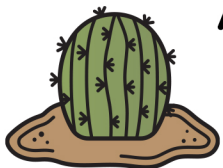
Gila woodpeckers carve nesting holes in saguaro cacti.

Cactus roots spread out wide, close to the surface.

Cactus roots grow deep underground to find water.



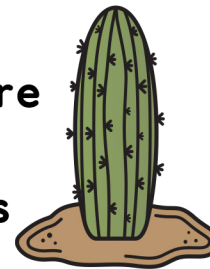
A cactus stem can expand after it rains.

Every cactus produces edible fruit.

There are more than 1,750 known species of cacti.



The Christmas cactus grows naturally in a rainforest.

A saguaro can take over 50 years to grow its first arm.

Cactus spines are used to help the plant collect extra sunlight.

Cacti are a type of succulent.



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
