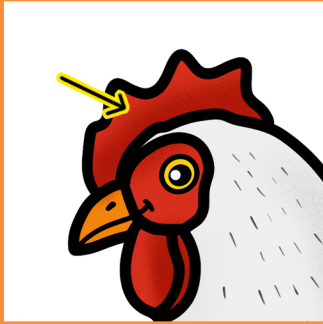


PARTS OF A CHICKEN VOCABULARY CARDS



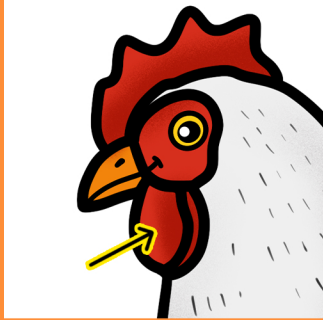
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comb

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The soft, floppy red part on top of a chicken's head. It helps the chicken cool off and can show if it is healthy.

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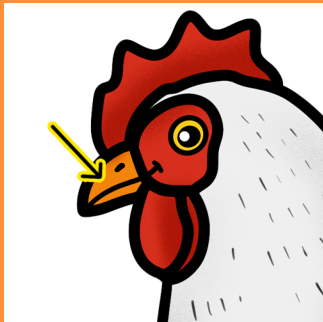
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wattle

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The red flap of skin that hangs under a chicken's chin. Like the comb, it helps keep the chicken cool.

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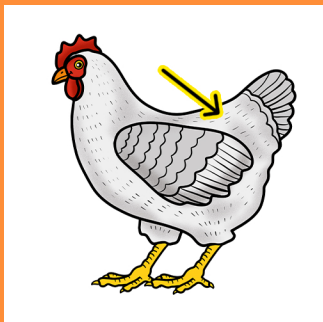
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beak

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The hard, pointed part of a chicken's mouth. Chickens use their beak to peck, eat, and drink.

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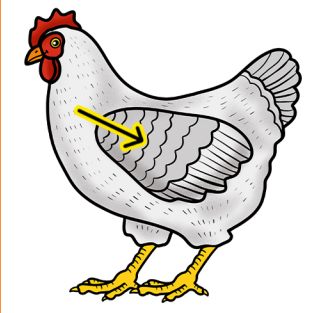
feathers

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The soft covering that grows all over a chicken's body. Feathers keep chickens warm and dry, and help them show off pretty colors.

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PARTS OF A CHICKEN VOCABULARY CARDS



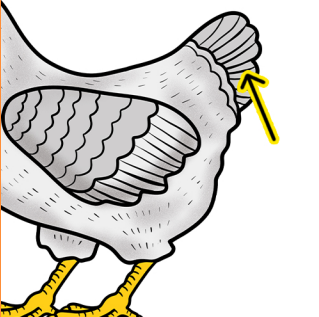
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wing

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The feathered part on each side of a chicken's body that is used for balancing, hopping, or gliding short distances.

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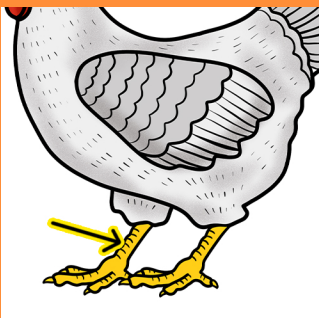
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tail

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The group of feathers at the back of a chicken that helps it balance and can show its mood.

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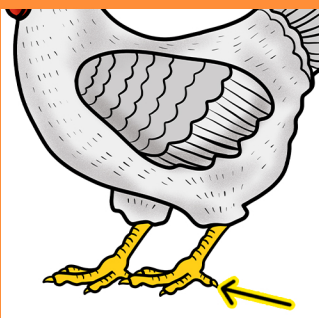
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leg

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The part of the chicken's body used for walking, running, and scratching at the ground to look for food.

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claw

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The sharp, curved part on the end of a chicken's foot that they use to scratch the dirt and search for bugs and seeds.

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
