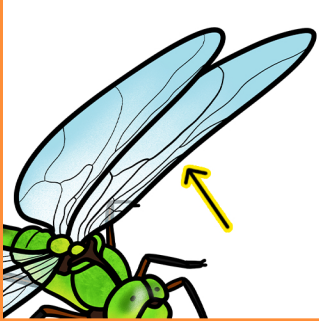


PARTS OF A DRAGONFLY VOCABULARY CARDS



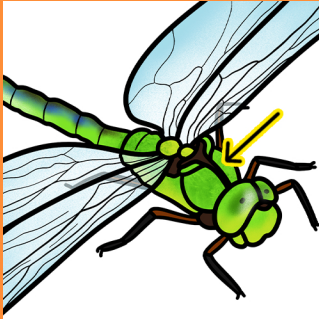
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wings

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Two pairs of clear, thin wings a dragonfly uses to fly; each pair can move on its own.

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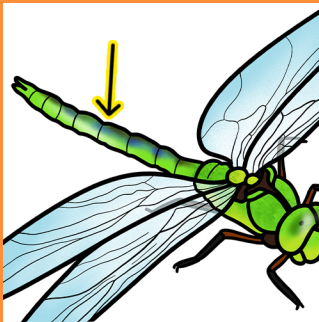
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thorax

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The middle section of a dragonfly's body, where the legs and wings attach.

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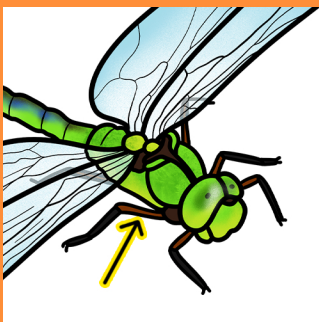
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abdomen

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The long, thin back section of a dragonfly's body, used for balance in flight.

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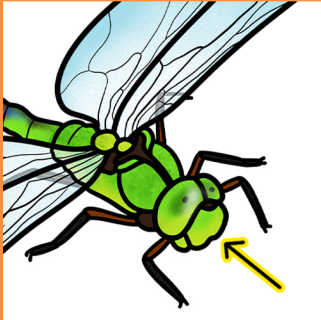
legs

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Six thin legs a dragonfly uses to perch and grab insects while flying, rather than for walking.

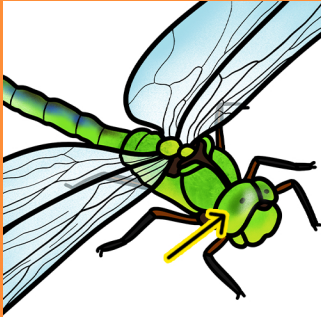
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head

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The front part of a dragonfly's body where the eyes, mouth, and antennae are found.

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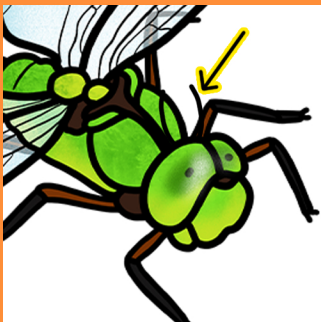
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compound
eyes

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Large, rounded eyes made up of thousands of tiny lenses, letting a dragonfly see in many directions at once.

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antennae

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Two very short feelers on a dragonfly's head, used to sense touch and movement in the air.

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
