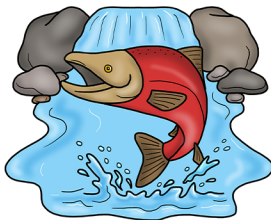


TWO TRUTHS & A LIE: SALMON

Salmon breathe air using lungs like a whale.



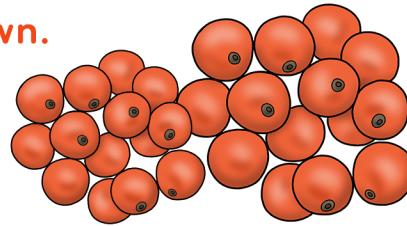
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TWO TRUTHS & A LIE: SALMON

Salmon always swim downstream to spawn.



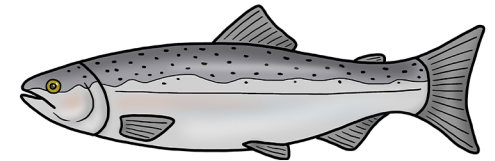
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TWO TRUTHS & A LIE: SALMON

Fish ladders help salmon get around dams.

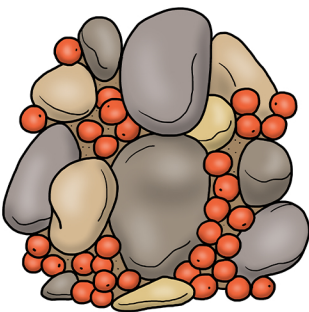


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TWO TRUTHS & A LIE: SALMON

Female salmon can lay thousands of eggs at once.

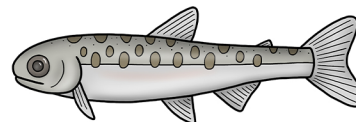
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TWO TRUTHS & A LIE: SALMON

Young salmon start their journey by swimming downstream toward the ocean.



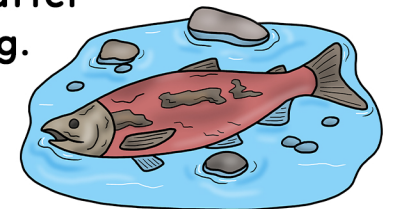
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TWO TRUTHS & A LIE: SALMON
